2 MADAM CHAIR GONZALES: I'll welcome
3 Christina Goeke. First things first, yep, let's turn
4 your microphone on. There you go. Am I pronouncing your
5 name correctly?

6 CHRISTINA GOEKE: Goeke, yes ma'am.

7 MADAM CHAIR GONZALES: Goeke? Okay. I'm
8 trying. Welcome. Thank you for joining us. If you can
9 please state your name, any organization you represent,
10 and proceed to testimony. You'll have three minutes.

11 CHRISTINA GOEKE: Thank you, Madam Chair.
12 My name is Christina Goeke. I am a resident of Colorado
13 Springs and cofounder of Rocky Mountain Women's Network.
14 I am here to voice my opposition to HB24-1071, also known
15 as Tiara's Law. I am blown away that felons were ever
16 given the right to change their names, and I believe we
17 should not be making it easier. A convicted felon should
18 be aware that there are consequences to their actions.
19 Otherwise, what is stopping people with no conscience
20 from committing crimes?

21 Also, allowing felons to legally change
22 their name is dangerous to the public. The public does
23 not have access to people's Social Security numbers. The
24 best we can do when sizing up a potential friend, a love
25 interest, or babysitter is a Google search or use a

1 website like TruthFinder. If we don't even have the
2 correct name of the person we are looking into, how would
3 we know if they were a sex offender, pedophile, or
4 murderer?

5 The proponents of this bill will say that
6 the crimes stay with the Social Security number of the
7 felon, but how does that help the general public? We do
8 not give each other our Social Security numbers. We give
9 each other our names. This bill would make it easier for
10 predators to target single moms, young women, and
11 children. There is no reason why we should be helping
12 felons to make it easier to hide their crimes. Does
13 Colorado value the feelings of convicted felons more than
14 that of women and children who will most likely be put in
15 more danger by this bill?

16 This law is named after Mr. Duane -- has
17 given himself Tiara. Mr. Duane Powell took the name --

18 MADAM CHAIR GONZALES: I'm sorry.

19 CHRISTINA GOEKE: -- Tiara Latrice to
20 appropriate a female name and to impersonate women --

21 MADAM CHAIR GONZALES: Excuse me.

22 CHRISTINA GOEKE: -- while hiding his
23 former crimes. Are you going to tell me that I cannot
24 speak truthfully now? I must lie to speak? I will not
25 tell a lie. A man is a man. His name is Duane Powell.

1 MADAM CHAIR GONZALES: And I am telling
2 you, Ms. Gake -- Goek -- Ms. Goeke, that as we stated --

3 CHRISTINA GOEKE: Go ahead. Tell me.

4 MADAM CHAIR GONZALES: As we stated, there
5 will be no misgendering or dead-naming.

6 CHRISTINA GOEKE: I do not respect
7 (inaudible) at all because that would force me to lie,
8 and I will not lie about someone's sex.

9 MADAM CHAIR GONZALES: You can continue --

10 CHRISTINA GOEKE: Do you want to infringe
11 on my free speech? Because this is my time. You are
12 violating my First Amendment rights if you tell me that I
13 cannot call a man a man. How can I advocate for women if
14 I can't even define what a --

15 MADAM CHAIR GONZALES: Welcome.

16 CHRISTINA GOEKE: -- woman is?

17 MADAM CHAIR GONZALES: Welcome. Thank you
18 for being here. If you would like to proceed with the
19 remainder of your time, you certainly can. You have 24
20 seconds remaining.

21 CHRISTINA GOEKE: Okay. Mr. Duane was
22 admitted that he --

23 MADAM CHAIR GONZALES: Again --

24 CHRISTINA GOEKE: -- was engaged in
25 prostitution --

1 (Banging of gavel.)

2 CHRISTINA GOEKE: -- not only (inaudible)
3 he was a felon (inaudible) changing his name, but he was
4 trying to hide the fact that he is male.

5 MADAM CHAIR GONZALES: Thank you.

6 CHRISTINA GOEKE: A felon with a sex crime
7 history should not be allowed to change his name.

8 (Soft background talking that is inaudible.)

9 MADAM CHAIR GONZALES: Have a good day.
10 Have a good day. Thank you.
